



Competition History

Boxing

Boxing dates back to Egypt around 3000 BC and entered the ancient Olympic Games in the 7th century BC. During the Roman Empire, boxers used gloves studded with metal, which often resulted in the death of one gladiator. Boxing has been in every edition of the Games since 1904, except Stockholm 1912, when it was banned under Swedish law. Women's boxing debuted at London 2012. Many legendary boxers – such as Muhammad Ali, Sugar Ray Leonard, and Floyd Mayweather Jr (above) – made their names at the Olympic Games. Ali, then called Cassius Clay, almost did not go to the Rome 1960 Games – where he won a pivotal gold medal – because he was scared of flying. In boxing there are two bronze medals – both semi-final losers receive one, rather than fight for one.

4. participants

4.1 Eligibility

the competitor only belonging to NOCs of member countries of south Asia Olympic council [SAOC] and who comply with the constitution and rules of SAOC/OCA/ASBC/AIBA are entitled to participate in the 13th south Asian games boxing competition.

4.2 No competitor under the age of 19 years and 40 years ,as of the 1st December ,2019 is permitted to participate.

4.3 The competitor must have an international competition record Book in which a qualified Doctor of medicine must certify him/her as fit to box.

4.4 Each participating NOC can enter one [1] boxer in each event as specified in 3 above.

4.5 Each team is entitled to send official(s) as ;

Men's section

01 to 02 Boxers - 01 coach
03 to 05 Boxers - 02 coaches
05 to 10 Boxers - 03 coaches

Women's section ;

01 to 02 Boxers - 01 coaches
03 Boxers above - 02 coaches

Each country may nominate 01 Neutral R/judge and 01 manager either or both the team(s) i.e.

men/ women

5. Entries

5.1 preliminary entry [By number]

The preliminary entry by number from all countries must be received by the OS-SAG with intimation to the national Olympic committee of NEPAL not later than 15 October,2019.

5.2 final entry (By name)

the final entry by name of all the competitors/team officials must be received by the OC-SAG with intimation to the national Olympic committee of Nepal not later than 15 NOV,2019. after expiry of the deadline prescribed for the final entry, no additions /changes of competitors will be allowed .

5.3 final confirmation

Team manager/official representative of each countries must submit the final confirmation of Boxer(s) (men and women) to the OC-SAG Boxing technical committee immediately after the technical meeting to be held on 5 December,2019.

6. competition Rules and regulations

6.1 the Boxing competition shall be held in accordance with the current AIBA rules. in case of disagreement over the interpretation of the rules, the English text shall prevail. Any unforeseen incident not covered by the rules shall be resolved in accordance with the AIBA/ASBC/SAOC/OCA constitution and Rules. in all disputes the decisions of GTCC will be final.

6.2 Bouts

the AIBA approved scoring system will be used in all bouts. The scoring system will be based on a 10 point must system.

6.3 weigh-in

The weigh-in will be conducted by the technical delegates as per AIBA rules.

7.Equipment

All equipment and technical will be conformity with the rules of AIBA.

7.1 Ring

The ring will be installed according to AIBA specifications.

7.2 Gloves, head guards(only for woman boxers) and Bandages

AIBA approved equipment will be supplied by the organizing committee

7.3 Protect Cup for men and Hair cover for Women and Gum shield

Protect Cup and hair cover and Gum Shied shall manage by the team but no RED color of Gum Shied is allowed.

8 Draws :

The draw for the competition shall take place after the medical examination and weigh-in as per AIBA rules.

9. Medical:

9.1 doping control;

During the 13th south Asian games, doping control testes will be conducted in accordance with the rules and instruction of IOC,AIBA,WADA and SAOC.

9.2 Medical facilities:

Medical facilities will be available at the accommodation ,training and competition venues.

10 Disputes

Any dispute arise during the competition will be scouted as per AIBA Competition rules and Regulations.

11.Mangament Information

11.1 Competition Management :

Boxing Governing body in Nepal and 12th South Asian Games Technical Committee on consultation with completion management shall be responsible for organization and management of Boxing Competition .

12. Technical Organization :

12.1 The service of technical delegates shall be acquired from ASBC for supervising the competitions. He/she will be provided with free Boarding ,lodging ,Transport and other facilities as per existing rules.

12.2 technical officials :

maximum technical officials shall be appointed from the host countries, Nepal. However, one Technical officials each from the participating country may be nominated. They shall be entitled to facilities as per existing rules of GTCC.

12.3 Neutral referees/judges :

ASBC shall appoint neutral referees/judges for the competition in addition to other technical officials . they shall be entitled to facilities as per the existing rules.

13. Dress code:

Boxers shall be dressed in accordance with th AIBA Rules for International competitions.

competitors shall box in :

- . light boots or shoes without spikes and without any heels.
 - . socks
 - . shorts not to exceed knee length
 - . very covering the chest and back
 - . either a red or blue singlet depending on the color of their corner, which shall be their own responsibility .
- singlet can display the name of the boxers country and crest in accordance with AIBA size and specifications (not more than 10 cm). where trunks and vests are of the same color, the belt line must be clearly indicated by using an elastic waistband 10cm wide.

14. commendation:

14.1 victory and ceremonies

the victory and award ceremonies shall be held on the day of the finals. The awards for the first bout will be given after the completion of the second bout and so on. competitors receiving awards must wear their official NOC uniform. the victory and award ceremony shall be held after the completion of each match in front of the victory stand. Medal and flower bearers will take their position. medal winners will be escorted to the podium. The medals and flowers will be presented by the OC-SAG president or their special invites. The nationals anthem of the gold medal winner will be played and the country flags of the medalist will be hoisted.

14.2 Prizes

The Prizes for the Boxing Competition will be as follows:

14.3 Interviews with the Media:

Facilities for media interviews will be provided after the Victory Ceremony.

14.4 Meeting with Officials

Meeting of the Team Managers/Technical officials will be held on 9 dec , 2019 at the Boxing Venue immediate after the Final Competition and Medal distribution Ceremony is over.

14.5 Technical Information Centre (TIC)

Information for team Delegates will be available at the Technical Information Center. This Technical Handbook has been approved by the Asian Boxing Confederation (ASBC).

Transportation

A comprehensive transport system for athletes, team officials and technical officials will be available exclusively for the SAG 2019 Games. This will include

1. Transportation of the delegates from Tribhuban International Airport , Kathmandu (KTM) to the place of accommodation.
- 2.Regular shuttle service from accommodation to official competition venues and training venues.
3. Special transportation services for the opening and closing ceremonies.
4. Departure service from the accommodation to the airport

Athletes Accommodation

Different three star hotels will accommodate athletes, team officials during the period from December 4th - 10th, 2019. OC-SAG 2019 and the hotel management will provide all possible assistance to the athletes and the officials to make them feel comfortable and homely. It is our intention to provide best hospitality services to all our guests and make the 13th South Asian Games 2019, a memorable event.

Medical Services

A First-aid and Emergency Medical Service First Response will be provided during the SA Games to all participants at the competition and training venues. The service will comprise of a dedicated medical team supported by an ambulance service. Medical services will also be ensured at the accommodation for the athletes and officials which will include sports medicine, physiotherapy, general medicine, consultancy services and a 24 hour emergency services for acute needs. If patients require more specialized medical care, they will be transported to the SAG nominated hospitals and clinics. Any non-emergency care provided outside will be the expenses of the individual concerned.
